

## Using 'photo voice' in a CLE session

*'Helps you discuss things a little deeper...'*

### How it can be used:

Activity	Example questions
As an ice breaker	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• choose a photo that reflects housing issues in your community (for tenancy law CLE)</li><li>• choose a photo that reflects how you feel about the law (or a particular legal issue)</li><li>• choose a photo that reflects a legal issue in your community</li></ul>
To discuss an issue	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• choose a photo that reflects or represents a question someone might have about (a particular legal issue)</li><li>• choose a photo that reflects why someone might not act on their legal rights</li><li>•</li></ul>
For evaluation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• choose a photo that reflects how you felt about the law or issue before the workshop and one that reflects how you feel after the workshop</li><li>•</li></ul>

### Tips when using photos or pictures in an activity:

1. Lay out photos on a table or the floor with enough space for people to circle them
2. Ask people to spend 5 mins in silence walking around the photos and (without picking it up) select one that.....
3. Ask if everyone has chosen a photo
4. Provide an example yourself or ask a participant to pick up their picture, hold it so the group can see it and say why they choose it
5. Allow each person to have a turn (more than one person can choose the same photo)
6. Ask the group if they have any comments on the activity
