# **First Nations RRR Internship**

Kickstart your legal career with a paid placement. Community Legal Centres NSW is offering internships running for two weeks (10 working days) during university breaks in regional, rural, or remote community legal centres.

This is a chance for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to gain hands-on experience in a community legal centre that champions social justice and works closely with Aboriginal communities.

What's in it for you?

- Real-world exposure to the legal field
- Engage with frontline advocacy, courts, client interviews, and community networks
- Structured mentoring, networking and other opportunities
- Build connections with local Aboriginal communities

Interns will be paid under the Community Legal Centres NSW Enterprise Agreement (Grade 3, Level 4) for two weeks, seven hours per day. Travel and accommodation will be provided depending on placement location.

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible for a place in the internship, you will need to be:

- 1. Enrolled in a university degree or equivalent
- 2. Of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent
- 3. Have an interest in social justice

#### **Duties and Commitments**

- Complete CLCNSW and Host Orientation
- Attend placement on time and be in good communication with Host Supervisor and **CLCNSW**
- Complete tasks set out in Student Contract
- Complete a Media Task set out by CLCNSW
- Complete Student Profile for student promotion
